Help Us Reach Our Goal: Annual District Survey

We need your voice! As part of the district's annual data collection process, the **School Climate Survey** is now open, and we have a goal to gather survey responses from at least **70% of our families**. Your feedback is crucial as it helps us plan and improve the school experience for all students. The data collected from this survey will guide efforts to enhance school culture, safety, connectedness, and social-emotional learning.

The survey is open through **Friday**, **March 21**, **2025**, and is available for all parents and caregivers to complete. It should take no longer than **10 minutes** to finish—just 10 minutes of your time can make a big difference for our school! The survey is available online in **English** and the five district threshold languages. You can find the Family Survey and access it in multiple languages through this link: **School Climate Surveys**.

If we hit our 70% response rate, we'll celebrate with an **Otter Pop party** for students—let's make it happen! The survey results also play an important role in supporting the district's priorities, including actions related to the **LCAP** (**Local Control and Accountability Plan**) and the **California School Dashboard**. Your input is vital for our continued progress. Look out for the survey link via ParentSquare, email, social media, and other communication channels. Thank you for helping us meet our goal!

Ramadan: A Time for Reflection and Spiritual Growth

Ramadan is one of the holiest months for Muslims, observed through fasting, prayer, and acts of charity. Muslims fast from dawn until sunset to commemorate the revelation of the Qur'an, focusing on self-control, gratitude, and compassion. The month is a time for spiritual growth, with increased devotion through prayer, Qur'anic recitation, and reflection. Muslims also avoid negative actions like gossip and arguing, aiming to improve both spiritually and morally.

Throughout Ramadan, Muslims gather for special prayers and social events, including the nightly Taraweeh prayers and community iftar dinners. Many mosques host food drives and charity events to help those in need. The month concludes with Lailat al-Qadr, the Night of Power, believed to be when the Qur'an was revealed, followed by the celebration of Eid ul-Fitr, a joyful occasion marked by prayer, feasts, and community gatherings.

Honoring Cesar Chavez Day: March 31st
