LEARNING INTENTIONS






Learning intentions are Student friendly descriptions of what they

DETENTION POLICY




East Campus detention will be held daily after school:

- Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday & Friday: 2:30 - 3:30pm
- Thursday: 1:30 2:30 pm.

Violations include:

- Teacher referral
- Skipping class
- Tardiness



- Non-participation/dressing for PE class
- Cell phone usage during class instruction
- Vulgar language
- Defiance/Disruption

Students not in detention on time will be required to attend the following day. Students not adhering to instructions while in detention may be dismissed and will owe another day of detention.

6 detentions within a month will result in a one day suspension.

Parents will be notified ahead of time if their child is serving detention.
